2023 United Way Campaign

For decades, Auto Club Enterprises (ACE) has united as an organization for our annual United Way campaign. This initiative aims to raise funds for United Way and its numerous nonprofit partner organizations dedicated to assisting individuals in our communities.

Off-Ramp



Kodachrome Nights

oliday lights appear ready to engulf the Auto Club headquarters building in this striking nighttime Kodachrome image from 1961. The exterior was repainted earlier that year, and the large neon Auto Club logo that graced the corner facade for 25 years was removed and not replaced. But even without the neon, the building's occupant remained clearly identified thanks to the lighted Auto Club signs flanking the building in this festive scene.

Rudimentary forms of colorized photography appeared in the mid-19th century. Most were hand-colored, which proved popular but still fell short of capturing natural color. The first commercially successful color film, Eastman Kodak's Kodachrome color process, arrived in 1936, as did the German company Agfa's multilayer color film. Despite these advances, by the 1960s color photography was still uncommon. The film was expensive to buy and develop, and color's lengthy and complex processing relative to black-and-white film didn't lend it to widespread use. It wasn't until the late 1970s that color photography predominated in the pages of Westways.

Back to our scene, a 1959 Chevrolet Impala waits at the light, perhaps having just fueled up at the gas station on the corner at left. The 29.9 cents per gallon price is equal to about \$3.10 in today's dollars. Traditionally, the Auto Club turned on its holiday lights at head-quarters every year on December 13th, the club's official birthday. These days, the exterior light show is scaled back to just the Moreton Bay fig tree that still overlooks the courtyard entrance, just like it did in 1961.

Westways is celebrating the centennial of the Auto Club's historic Los Angeles office by featuring it in each Off-Ramp of 2023.
